Where to buy Compostable* Bags

If you are using a bag to line your kitchen pail or curbside green cart, make sure they are always compostable.

Quick Tips

Organics



Can you eat it? It's organic. Is it part of food leftovers? (a bone; peel)? It's organic. Did it originate in nature (wooden popsicle stick)? It's organic. Is it growing in my yard? It's organic. Did my pet shed it (fur, hair, feathers)? It's organic!

Co-Mingled Recycling



Paper and cardboard includes pizza boxes, toilet paper and paper towel tubes, envelopes, greeting cards, non-foil wrapping paper, shredded paper (tied in a transparent plastic bag). If your plastic is stretchy, like a grocery bag, it's recyclable. Crinkly like a chip bag or cereal box insert? Not.

Household Waste



By the time you truly separate Organic and Co-mingled recyclables, your regular waste will be almost nothing!

That's your measure of success!

Why Participate?

Bylaws around organic material diversion are set by individual municipalities in the province of Alberta. Within the MD of Foothills, the ban of organics material from landfill may begin in late 2017. It has been proven conclusively that fully 50% of regular household waste is comprised of food products. The Lake at Heritage Pointe community will divert, at minimum, 213.5 metric tonnes of organic waste away from landfill each year.

The LAHPOA will enjoy increased savings in waste management costs through reduction of waste to landfill.

Community Standards

All carts <u>must</u> be stored out of sight, preferably inside each homeowner's garage. If this is problematic, **ensure your storage location is invisible** from the street and **not visually offensive to your neighbour.** Please respect your neighbour's sightlines and the visual integrity of our beautiful community!

Placing Carts Curbside

Carts should be placed curbside **no earlier than 5:00 a.m. on day of pickup, returned to storage no later than 9:00 p.m. the same day.** Storage and use of carts will be strictly monitored and enforced.

Three Streams:

Organics: Green Cart



All kitchen food waste; compostable* paper dinnerware; grass, leaves & yard waste; used kitty litter; napkins, paper towel, facial tissue; dryer lint; pet or human hair; paper bags & boxboard; waxy paper; cardboard; toothpicks; tea bags/coffee & paper filters.

Co-mingled Recyclables: Blue Cart



Metal & tin containers; plastic bottles & containers with codes #1 - #7; glass bottles & jars; Tetra Paks; office paper; magazines; glossy flyers; packing paper; telephone books; newsprint; non-waxy cardboard; shrink wrap; plastic bags; catalogues.

Household Waste: Black Cart



Plastic cutlery, straws, coffee lids; CD covers; foam packaging; broken glass; polystyrene foam packaging; clam-shell plastic packaging; "crinkly" chip bags (stretchy plastics go in your blue box); toothpaste tubes; diapers; sanitary wipes & napkins; tin foil; single-use coffee K-cups.

Using your Carts

Streetside Placement



Arrows point to the street; your wheels and handle face your home. Remember to leave space between carts for the truck's automated arm to embrace each cart.

Lids **must** be closed tightly. Crush, fold or flatten your blue cart content to optimize space. No standalone bags.

May I acquire an extra organics bin for my grass?

Extra clippings may be deposited in the large bin at the Lake House.

How do I bag it?

Use **CLEAR** garbage/waste bags in your **BLACK** cart.

NO bag is necessary in your **BLUE** cart.

NO bag is required for your **GREEN** cart. However, **COMPOSTABLE*** bags are permitted. Line your organics kitchen-caddie with an organics bag and deposit it directly to your green cart. Line the cart's bottom with newspaper or kitty litter to absorb moisture and odour.

NO bag is required for your grass clippings or yard waste when deposited in your **GREEN** cart!

No No's for any Cart!

Use Landfill or Salvage Centre for these:



Houseware items; toys; sporting goods; shoes and clothing; batteries; propane tanks; hazardous materials; electronics; building materials; scrap metal; appliances.
