

LAHPOA Beach Reopening Strategy

ASSUMPTIONS

- The LAHPOA will comply with all Chief Medical Officer of Health (CMOH) directives and follow all Alberta Health Service guidelines.
- Staff and volunteer safety will be our highest priority.
- Any verbal or other abuse to staff and volunteers will not be tolerated and will result in the loss of Lake Access privileges for the remainder of the season.
- The LAHPOA will provide equitable and balanced water access to all residents.
- **All residents are required to reserve a time and date for beach and Lake access via the online registration system that will be launched in Phase 2, NO EXCEPTIONS. Information to follow.**

PHASE 1: PLAYGROUNDS AND LAKE SURFACE ACCESS

MAY 14TH, 2020

- Lakefront homeowners may use the Lake AT THEIR OWN RISK provided they adhere to the following restrictions:
 - Acknowledge the Lake is not considered to be a safe temperature at this time.
 - In the event of an emergency, residents must call 9-1-1 on their own.
 - Acknowledge that the Lake is NOT supervised.
 - Residents must provide their own PFD's/life jackets.
 - No docking of watercraft on LAHPOA beach or LAHPOA boat dock.
- All other residents may launch watercraft (kayak; canoe; paddleboard) from the North Dock AT THEIR OWN RISK provided they adhere to the following restrictions:
 - Acknowledge the Lake is not considered to be a safe temperature at this time.
 - Residents must provide their own PFD's/life jackets.
 - Acknowledge that the Lake is NOT supervised.
 - No docking of watercraft on LAHPOA beach or LAHPOA boat dock.
 - No swimming or fishing is permitted from the North Dock.
- The Lake House Facility/Beach/Park remain closed to all residents.
- The playgrounds at Heritage Isle and the North Dock are open for use. Residents are requested to practice physical distancing guidelines and hand hygiene. These playgrounds will not be sanitized or supervised by the LAHPOA.
- The Sports Court is open to residents provided they adhere to the following restrictions:
 - Limited to use by two persons at one time except for a group made up of residents from a single-family dwelling.
 - Users must provide their own equipment.
 - The Sport Court will not be sanitized by the LAHPOA.

PHASE 2: LAHPOA BEACH/LAKE OPEN – 2 HOUR DESIGNATED TIME SLOTS

JUNE 15TH, 2020

- To ensure equitable access by all residents in the community, members are required to **RESERVE A TIME AND DATE FOR ENTRY AND USE OF BEACH FACILITIES**. No entry will be permitted without prior registration, no exceptions. The scheduling system will be delivered via our website at www.lahp.ca. Date forthcoming.
 - Users may schedule one two-hour time slot, twice each week. Group block is limited to six persons, all living under one roof. No outside guests are permitted at this time. Photo identification providing proof

of street address is MANDATORY at point of entry, no exceptions. The schedule will be open for booking each Sunday for the following week. Access to the Beach and Lake Park are subject to change in accordance with CMOH and AHS mandates.

- Reduced Hours of Operation – Monday to Sunday 11am - 7 pm
- Use of facilities limited to resident households only, NO outside guests permitted.
- Lake House will remain CLOSED except for access to washrooms on the lower level.
 - Showers – CLOSED
 - Washroom use by one family group at one time for physical distancing.
 - Washrooms and foot shower will be thoroughly sanitized once each hour.
- Current CMOH directives limit number of residents permitted within the park to 50 (subject to change).
- LAHPOA Lake and Beach will be OPEN for access provided the following restrictions are adhered too:
 - Practice physical distancing at all times: Remain 2 metres apart from non-family members.
 - Access/Egress will be monitored/controlled through the Loading Gate entry.
 - Residents will reserve their two-hour time slot PRIOR to coming to the Lake; NO EXCEPTIONS.
 - Photo proof of identity/address required, NO EXCEPTIONS.
 - Waivers signed and filed PRIOR to coming to the Lake.
 - Residents will follow the rope line designation system for the entry/exit of recreation areas.

Note: These measures provide the LAHPOA with a system for contact tracing, therefore NO EXCEPTIONS will be made.

- Beach and adjoining grass areas will be roped off into blocks; maximum family size per block will be six members.
- No access to firepit bench seating or picnic tables.
- Main Dock – CLOSED
- Floating Dock – CLOSED
- Swimming at the beach – Permitted with physical distancing but the risk is unknown.
- Beach/sand play - Permitted with physical distancing but the risk is unknown.
- Playground – Permitted with physical distancing; this structure will not be sanitized by the HOA.
- Fishing – Permitted from watercraft launched from the North Dock or lakefront homeowner private docks using personal equipment; NO fishing equipment owned by the LAHPOA will be available for use; NO fishing permitted from the North Dock or Beach.
- Sharing of food and beverages is discouraged; if you pack it in, please pack it out.
- NO launch of watercraft (canoes; paddleboards; kayaks) permitted from the Beach.
- NO docking of watercraft on the beach or LAHPOA main dock.
- NO watercraft owned by the LAHPOA (canoes; paddleboards; pedal boats) will be available for use.
- The North Dock will continue to be the launch point for watercraft owned by non-lakefront residents. This location will not be sanitized or supervised by the LAHPOA. Practice physical distancing.
- Residents must supply their own PFD's/life jackets.
- Hand sanitization stations will be available and maintained within the park to help prevent the spread of COVID to other residents.
- Practice safe hand hygiene at high-use touch points: foot shower; door handles; washrooms; playground.
- The Lake House is closed to rentals.
- The LAHPOA has contracted ALS Environmental Services to monitor the Lake for total coliforms and E. Coli in the absence of this service through AHS in 2020.
